

## Consortium Changes in 2018

**The new year brings a big change to the Granville Public Library.** GPL will be switching to the Central Library Consortium (CLC) in March 2018. What does this mean to you? We will join a sharing partnership with many large public libraries including Bexley, Worthington, Upper Arlington, and the Columbus Metropolitan Library System, giving you access to over 5 million items. Additional benefits include faster delivery times for items requested from other libraries and auto-renewal for your checked out items.

### Dates you need to know:

**January 2**—Patrons and staff will temporarily be unable to place holds from other libraries in our existing consortium. Requests placed prior to this date will be filled.

**March 5 & 6**—The switch will begin. Checkout and catalog systems will be down. You will be able to check out items, but you **MUST** have your GPL library card to do so.

**March 7**—The switch will be complete and we'll be back to business as usual. Any unfilled holds will transfer to our new consortium to be filled.

Your GPL card will work seamlessly as we make the change, however if you use a Licking County Library card with us, you will have to get a Granville library card.

Andrew Z. Katz is Associate Professor of Political Science and Class of 1954 Richard G. Lugar Professor in Public Policy at Denison University. He earned his doctorate in 1987 from The Johns Hopkins University and has been a member of Denison's faculty since 1993. He is most recently the author of *When Democracies Choose War: Politics, Public Opinion, and the Marketplace of Ideas* (Lynne Rienner, 2017). He teaches courses on United States foreign policy, theories of international politics, international security policy, and the Middle East in world affairs.
